

Closing Dairyland Greyhound Park

Most of you have heard by now that the last remaining dog track in Wisconsin, Dairyland Greyhound Park, closed its doors on December 31, 2009. This brought the end of an era, but not the end for greyhound adoption! There are still plenty of greyhounds retiring in other states who need our help. Though the dogs now come from long distances, instead of a local track, GPA-Wisconsin will continue to operate in the same manner we always have, with the same mission - find as many ideal, loving homes for retired racing greyhounds as possible.

The closing was announced in early

November, and at that time, local adoption organizations sprung to action by working together to move as many pet dogs as possible out of the facility ahead of time. In a coordinated effort dogs were moved locally and throughout the neighboring states. The estimated number of greyhounds who were placed into adoption prior to the close was approximately 200 dogs. In fact, at one point, all the available pet dogs had been moved from the track and there was a lull where no greyhounds were available. The remaining dogs at the track were all still racing.

Media coverage of the closing was incredible. Inquiries flooded the track and local groups like GPA-WI with requests for information about the dogs, the closing, and how to adopt.

The outpouring of concern and offers of assistance were greatly appreciated and resulted in an unprecedented surge in applications. At one point in early January, GPA-WI had over 100 applications in process - clearly a record for that time of year. In the end, the cooperative efforts of the



Heartworm disease is one of the most preventable illnesses our dogs can contract. It is spread via the mosquito and without prevention can result in adult worms that mature and migrate to the heart where they can cause a wide variety of complications, including death. GPA-WI recommends that you have your pet tested for Heartworm disease once per year, in the spring, and that you use a monthly heartworm preventative as part of a total wellness plan for your dogs.

As a courtesy to GPA-WI adopters, Healthy Pet Veterinary Clinic will host their annual heartworm clinic. Walk-ins only, please. This visit

should not replace an annual visit to your regular veterinarian for a full health check-up.

Re-vaccination is also being offered but please remember to bring your pet's vaccine history for the veterinarians to review.

- Heartworm 4DX Test
(4-way test: heartworm, Ehrlichia, Lyme disease and Anaplasma phagocytophilum)
- Rabies, Distemper Combination and Bordetella Vaccines
- Lyme Vaccine



Spring is in the air... Make sure your hound isn't sprung free from safety!

With warmer weather, this is the time of year we receive an increased number of calls about loose greyhounds.

Be sure your hound is safe by following these protocols!

- 1) Make sure your hound is wearing a collar with tags containing your current contact information, as well as their GPA ID tag.
- 2) Check your fences for damage, gaps or weak spots. Greyhounds have been known to sneak through a gap as small as 6 inches!
- 3) Check your gates. Make sure they close tightly and have clips or carabiners to keep them shut. Carabiners are available in our Online Store on the website home page. www.gpawisconsin.org
- 4) Check storm & screen doors for appropriate latches. Consider baby gates in doorways that lead to outside areas that are unfenced.
- 5) Check leashes & collars for condition and make sure they are appropriately adjusted. A carabiner clip added to the leash and collar makes an excellent second form of safety.
- 6) Practice recall in the safety of your home or fenced yard.
- 7) Repeat these safety protocols to all family members and guests to your home.
- 8) If your hound does get loose, contact GPA-WI right away for help.

Have a question about your Greyhound? Help is at your fingertips!

Is my Greyhound bored? Why is my Greyhound bumping into me on our walks? Are Greyhounds supposed to sleep that much? What do I do about my Greyhound's bad breath?

These are just a few of the greyt questions our new adopters have. If you are new to life with a retired Greyhound, have no fear! The answers to these questions and many more can be found on **Our Greyt Forum!** We will always encourage you to read the books on the reading list and call your adoption coordinator with questions but, we also want to encourage all of our adopters, new and old, to join our forum. On the forum, you will find many of your questions answered or you can post a question and receive suggestions and support from our devoted Greyhound community!

Using the forum is easy!

1. Go to our website, www.gpawisconsin.org.




2. Under the heading and logo you will see the contents of our site from left to right. On the far right is, "Our Greyt Forum." Click there and the forum will come up. This is a public forum. You do not need to register to view or read any of the topics that are listed.
3. Next, simply choose and click on a category. Under the "General Topics" category, for example, you'll see the first section for "Announcements" followed by "Sticky Topics." Sticky Topics are

those the moderators have chosen to keep in view as they may be valuable and always important information for quick reference. The next section will be the "Topics" for every day sharing and discussion. Topics most recently posted to will be listed first. Click on any of these to read the discussion. Other categories may or may not have the "Announcements" or "Sticky" headings.

That was easy but, now you want to ask a question or comment on an interesting topic. You can do that by registering! Not sure yet? Look at the top of the page just under the GPA-WI heading. You will find a link to "Frequently Asked Questions" which cover just about everything you might want to know about using the forum. You'll also see a link to register. Go for it! Once you have completed the registration, it will take a bit until you are activated. This is a manual process and may take a day or two. Please be patient!

- Once you've been activated, you may post a new topic by;
1. Logging in
 2. Choosing the category (General Topics, Medical/Health, etc.)
 3. Click on the "New Topic" button near the top left of the page
 4. Put in your subject
 5. Fill in the text box
 6. Choose "preview" to see how your message will look. Edit if necessary
 7. Choose "submit"



You may reply to a post by choosing "Post Reply" when reading the posts on a topic.

If you're still feeling shy about posting, you can search the forum to see if your question has been asked before. Look to the top of the page and you will see a "Search" link. Click on "Search" and enter a keyword in the space provided. Topics containing your keyword will come up for you to choose from.

There are other bells and whistles on the forum. Our hope is that this will give you a quick start to asking questions, finding answers, sharing stories and pictures and celebrating our Greyhounds!



Don't forget to check out other sections of the website too, such as the Online Retail Store, Events Calendar and Events section of the forum. Its a quick and easy way to stay connected and find out what's going on We hope to see you and your hound on the forum and around town sometime soon!

regional adoption groups, the track management, kennel operators and racing owners, resulted in 400 greyhounds being placed into adoption. Most of the Dairyland dogs are now enjoying the comforts of retirement life with their new families.

With no local source of retired greyhounds to draw from, and the aforementioned surge in applications, GPA-WI found itself in an unusual situation. For the first time (that I know of), we had more applications than dogs! We received about 65 Dairyland dogs into the program around the time of the close and weeks that followed, but with dozens of applications still in process, there were no more dogs available. We had prepared for a situation of great surplus, but ended up with a shortage. Regional groups were geared up for the possibility of an additional 500 dogs needing a place to go when the track closed, when in reality, there were probably less than 200 dogs that moved into adoption after December 31st. In the weeks prior to the close, hauls had been scheduled to transport what we thought would be hundreds of dogs across the region. Those hauls actually were canceled due to lack of dogs and the local groups negotiated to distribute the last of the Dairyland hounds among us. Approximately 250 dogs went on to other tracks to race, mostly in Florida, and a small handful of dogs were returned to their owners.

In light of the unusual circumstances, we made the unorthodox decision to bring in dogs from Florida on January 1, 2010, not even 12 hours after Dairyland had closed. We were informed that haulers were coming to Dairyland to take some of the racers to Florida. The hauls were coming to Wisconsin with empty trailers, so GPA-WI made a decision to utilize that situation to our advantage. A dozen retired racers from Orlando were loaded into a hauler on December 31st, and made their way to Wisconsin as the last races were being held at Dairyland.

To say that this was a shock to the adoption groups that were aware of the situation would be an understatement. I received calls and emails from other GPA chapters and independent groups asking me if it was true, that we were bringing in Florida dogs so soon after the closing. I confirmed that this was true, but tried to keep these new developments quiet to the majority of people. The reason for this was that in the middle of all the media hype and increased interest, we didn't want people to think there was no longer a need to help, or that GPA-WI would no longer have dogs. We trudged forward into uncharted territory with the goal of placing as many retired racers as possible, no matter where they last raced.

In the first three months of 2010, greyhounds from Florida, Alabama, Oklahoma, and Kansas have come into our program to find homes. GPA-Wisconsin has completed 94 adoptions from January to March 2010 - that's more than half the adoptions completed all last year.

Groups who have shipped dogs to us have been extremely thankful and appreciative for our help. It has

been exceptionally rewarding to know we are making a difference not only here in Wisconsin, but across the country where greyhounds are waiting to start retirement life.

As we continue our goal of placing retired racing greyhounds in loving homes, we hope you will continue to show your support for our organization by participating in our events, donating to our fundraising efforts and promoting greyhound adoption wherever possible.

GPA-Wisconsin would like to sincerely thank all of our volunteers, supporters and colleagues in greyhound adoption who put in endless hours over the last several months. Your efforts insured the Dairyland closing would proceed smoothly and we are proud to be on the same team completing our parallel mission. Greyhound adoption is alive and well in Wisconsin. We expect to unite many more families with a loving greyhound companion in the years ahead.

Inside this newsletter, you will find a donation envelope. We ask you to consider making a donation in whatever amount you can afford or whatever amount seems appropriate, to help GPA-Wisconsin continue its mission of placing retired racing greyhounds in ideal loving homes.

With the large number of dogs brought into the program over the last several months, GPA-Wisconsin's expenses have greatly increased. To prepare a dog for adoption the cost is approximately \$300. This is for a healthy hound with no complications. Frequently, a dog will need additional testing for parasites, bloodwork, or assessment of an old injury. This adds additional expense. With an adoption fee of \$200, GPA-Wisconsin literally loses money on each dog we bring into the program, so we need your support and generosity to stay ahead of those incoming bills.

GPA-Wisconsin has no paid positions. We are run solely by the generosity
